In his First Letter to the Corinthians, the Apostle Paul puts forth one of the most important requirements for the Christian Life. He said, "Whatever you do, do it all for the glory of God."

The Bible provides many illustrations of how this should be worked out in practical ways and of believers who exhibited such child-like humility.

That being said, such character does not come naturally, or overnight, even to the most serious-minded. However, it is not optional, otherwise the New Testament writers, including the Lord Jesus Himself, would not have strongly encouraged pursuit of it.

It is also noteworthy that Revelation chapter eleven makes clear that this is the standard by which the Church will be measured throughout history!
