There is a very popular teaching out there in the Christian world that under the New Testament Covenant God no longer visits judgement upon people, especially professing Christians, for sin. This is a very dangerous and erroneous representation of Grace and completely contradicts a large portion of New Testament teaching.

In the Book of Acts, the Apostle Peter pronounces judgement on Ananias and his wife Sapphira for lying to the Holy Spirit, and later on Simon the Magician for thinking he could buy God's Gift with money.

In one of his Letters, the Apostle Paul instructs the assembly to hand a man guilty of adultery with his stepmother over to Satan for the destruction of the flesh.

Consider also the strong judgements and rebukes Jesus pronounces over certain individuals in the Seven Churches of Revelation and over those who tolerate them.

Finally, in another of Paul's Letters he warns that sickness and even death has come upon believers for partaking of the Lord's Supper in an unworthy manner.
